



What Is Kindergarten Readiness?

Readiness is...

a child who **listens**

- to a story for 10-15 minutes without restlessness
- to directions without interrupting
- to follow 2-3 step directions

a child who can **self-care**

- to blow their nose
- to use the bathroom and vocalize they need to go
- to wash their hands when needed
- *to button, zip, tuck in shirt, tie shoes*

a child who demonstrates **flexibility**

- when the routine is interrupted
- when a new situation arises
- and adjusts when they can't be first, win or get the book/toy they want
- to adjust to opposition or defeat without crying or sulking
- to ask for help when needed

a child who **respects**

- adults and friends
- the rules at school
- safety rules on the playground and on field trips

a child who **speaks clearly** and can

- express their wants and needs effectively
- stay on topic during class discussions
- tell/retell a story in correct sequence

a child who **works**

- without easily being distracted
- and follows directions to complete a task
- and takes pride in his/her work

a child who **thinks** and can

- problem solve
- give the main idea of a story
- give reasons for his/her opinion

a child who demonstrates **fine motor skills**

- to use scissors properly
- to hold a pencil correctly
- to color with crayons

- to write their name, letters and numbers
- to open their lunchbox/snack and all containers within

a child who demonstrates **large motor skills**

- to run, skip, bounce a ball and jump
- to sit criss cross applesauce on the carpet

a child who **hears**

- words that rhyme
- syllables and claps them out
- how many sounds are in three letter words
- letters and their sounds

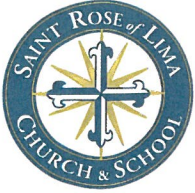
a child who **understands**

- and shares, takes turns
- and assumes his/her share of group responsibilities

Dear Parents,

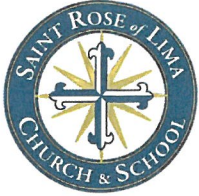
Tuesday, August 11th you and your child will ***“drop-in” for a visit*** in their Kindergarten classroom between 8:15 – 10:15 AM. Then, your child will come for their **first full day** of Kindergarten on **Wednesday, August 12th**. You will drop your child off between 7:30AM and 7:50AM, the tardy bell rings at 7:55AM. Pick up is between 3:05 PM and 3:25 in the carpool line.

Postcards will arrive during the first week of August. This will inform you who your child’s teacher will be! This is a long time standing and exciting tradition at Saint Rose! - *not the fat crayons*

1 ~ box of washable markers

2 ~ No. 2 pencils

- *regular size not the fat pencils*

2 ~ Pink Pearl erasers

1 ~ Fiskar for Kids scissors

1 ~ regular size pencil box

- not long and thin kind

1 ~ set of small headphones

- NOT earbuds
- put headphones in a gallon Ziploc bag with name on it

1 ~ box of Kleenex

1 ~ rolls of paper towels

- Goldfish, Ritz, Cheez-Its, etc
- *These will be used if a child occasionally forgets a snack.*

1 ~ complete change of clothing

- it does not have to be school uniform but make sure it is seasonally appropriate

1 ~ child size water bottle that can be refilled during the day (*not metal*)

Girls ~ 1 pack of white cardstock & solid pack each of black and red construction paper

Boys ~ 1 pack of black cardstock & solid pack each of blue and white construction paper
